## Content (Course Annotation)

The course aims to present students of the Bachelor of Theology with the Greek Koine language of the New Testament so that they can read the texts of the New Testament independently with the help of the dictionary. The course is designed to present Greek grammar in the New Testament, the most important rules of phonetics and morphology, and to give an insight into the major rules of Greek syntax inherent in the New Testament, as well as to teach the vocabulary.
