Content (Course Annotation)

The course looks at theological guidelines and principles for spiritual office and ministry, based on Scripture, Lutheran confessions and the LELB rules on the service of pastors. Students shall obtain an idea of the specific nature of the clergy position and the various fields of ministry, as well as the basic principles and basic tasks of pastoral ministry. The various aspects and areas of ministry are considered, as well as the risks of a pastoral position. The course looks at both the clergyman's serving in the congregation and beyond that.

Aims

- Introducing students to the scope of pastoral theology;
- to give an idea of its biblical and ecclesiastic historical roots;
- to introduce terminology for pastoral theology;
- provide basic knowledge in pastoral theology;
- developing a biblical and confessional understanding of the position and service of the pastor;
- offer guidelines for forming the personality of the minister.
